Prayer Thoughts: The Great Vigil of Easter is the primary and richest of the Easter celebrations and the first Eucharist of Easter is always celebrated with great joy. In accord with the Church's ancient tradition, this night is one of vigil for the Lord (*Exodus 12:42*). Since Good Friday the church has been silent. We have been waiting in prayerful expectation, reflecting on the love of God, confident of the triumph of his love over death.

Tonight, we join online to celebrate the Resurrection and share in a special way in the glory of the risen Christ.

Of course, this year it is not possible for us all to gather in our church buildings and so the Easter Vigil for 2021 must be shortened. In this year's Easter Vigil we shall celebrate, first, a simple Service of Light; second, a shortened Liturgy of the Word; third, a simple Renewal of Baptismal Promises; fourth, the Easter Eucharist of the Resurrection in which we celebrate our unity with the risen Christ and in which we are nurtured in Word and Sacrament for our own journey until we are at last one with him in our own resurrection.

When it is safe to open our churches fully again there will be the opportunity for a special celebratory Parish Eucharist with the Renewal of Promises at the Font. God bless,

NEW TESTAMENT READING: ROMANS 6: 3-11 - read by Gwen Adshead

Christ, having been raised from the dead, will never die again.

When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life. If in union with Christ we have imitated his death, we shall also imitate him in his resurrection. We must realise that our former selves have been crucified with him to destroy this sinful body and to free us from the slavery of sin. When a man dies, of course, he has finished with sin. But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised from the dead will never die again. Death has no power over him any more. When he died, he died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.

THE GOSPEL READING - MARK 16: 1 - 7

The Gospel reading changes each year according to the Church's three year lectionary.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Mark

When the Sabbath was over, Mary of Magdala, Mary the mother of James and Salome, brough spices with which to go and anoint him. And very early in the morning on the first day of the week they went to the tomb, just as the sun was rising.

But when they looked they could see the stone - which was very big – had already been rolled back. But you must go and tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going before you to Galilee; it is there you will see him, just as he told you."

Dear friends, through the paschal mystery we have been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life.

Now that we have completed our Lenten observance,

let us renew the promises we made in baptism

when we rejected Satan and his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in his holy Catholic Church. And so:

Do you reject sin, so as to live in the freedom of God's children?

All I do

Do you reject the glamour of evil, and refuse to be mastered by sin?

All I do.

Do you reject Satan, father of sin and prince of darkness?

All I do.

Then the priest continues:

Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth?

All I do.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?

All I do.

Priest Do you believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints,

the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body,

and life everlasting?

All I do.

The Priest concludes:

God, the all-powerful Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and forgiven all our sins.

May he also keep us faithful to our Lord Jesus Christ for ever and ever..

for the praise and glory of his name,

for our good, and the good of all his Church.

Priest Lord, accept the prayers and offerings of your people.

With your help may this Easter mystery of our redemption bring to perfection the saving work you have begun in us.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Priest The Lord be with you.

All And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

Father, all-powerful and ever-living God, we do well always and everywhere to give you thanks through Jesus Christ our Lord. We praise you with greater joy than ever on this Easter night, when Christ became our paschal sacrifice. He is the true Lamb who took away the sins of the world. By dying he destroyed our death; by rising he restored our life. And so, with all the choirs of angels in heaven we proclaim your glory and join in their unending hymn of praise:

Cantor Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might

heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord;

and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the + body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said:

Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you;

do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine.

Again he praised you, gave it to them and said:

Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and the cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith:

Cantor Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

Priest Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes

and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us into your loving arms and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint John the Evangelist,

Saint John the Baptist and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and

glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

If you normally receive Holy Communion in your own church, then you are welcome to do so at this Eucharist. If you would prefer a blessing, then please carry this service book in your hands when you come to the priest. When receiving Holy Communion, the people respond by saving:
